

Archdeacons' Parish Visitation

Information and Guidance

Introduction

The Archdeacon's Parish Visitation is a statutory Visitation and should take place every 5 years. In the Diocese of Manchester, such visitations are shared between the Archdeacon, Area Dean and Lay Chair, who will expect to meet with the Parish Priest and Churchwardens. The main purpose is to ensure that everything is in good order and that the legal requirements are being properly adhered to. However, it is also an opportunity for you to reflect on where you are up to in terms of the life, mission and ministry of the parish and to share something of that with your Archdeacon/Area Dean. Hence, the second part of the paperwork is based on the three key elements of Bishop Nigel's vision for the Diocese: that congregations grow, that giving increase and that communities be served.

In order for our time together to be as helpful and constructive as possible, please take some time to look through this document and to prepare carefully for the meeting. We would ask that the document is shared and worked through with the Churchwardens, Treasurer and Gift Aid Secretary where applicable.

Please send a completed copy of Part 2 to your Archdeacon or your Area Dean and Lay Chair at least two weeks before the date of their Visitation.

Part 1 – Inspections

Church

We will want to look around the Church, both outside and inside, and consider the state of the building in relation to the latest Quinquennial Inspection.

Please be prepared to discuss

- the fabric and general state of the building
- progress made on the recommendations in the QI report
- general security and insurance
- details of any breaches of security at the church or clergy home
- any theft of metal or other material
- access to the building for those with disabilities
- health and safety
- procedures for banking and the handling of money

Please have available on display your

- Child Protection policy
- insurance policy certificate



- certificates for any faculties that have been granted
- certificates for the electrical inspection, the lightning conductor, the servicing of the boiler, the fire-extinguishers
- Electoral Roll
- a list of any archived Registers and Documents

We will also want to see

- Terrier, Inventory and Log Book and check silver and other major items against the Inventory
- All of the current registers
- The PCC minute book
- The APCM minute book
- The parish's table of fees
- Any contracts and/or paperwork related to the employment of staff (organist, youth worker etc)
- Any licences for the use of music/videos etc in church
- Check condition of Hymn books, Service books and Bibles

Church Grounds and Boundaries

We will want to check the general maintenance, care and safety of the grounds to ensure that all is in line with the Churchyard Regulations, and, if you have one, discuss any issues relating to the graveyard.

Hall (if applicable)

We will want to look around the Hall/Community Centre both outside and inside, and consider the state of the building

As with the Church building, please be prepared to discuss

- the fabric and general state of the building
- any work that needs doing and its costs
- access to the building for those with disabilities
- security and insurance
- health and safety

Please have available the insurance policy certificate

Parsonage House

We will want to be assured that the house is in a good state of repair and that it adequately meets the needs of you and your family. A conversation about general fuel costs and the level of efficiency would be helpful.

Other Properties

We will want to know of any other properties for which the parish has some responsibility, such as a curate's house, church school etc.

...THAT GIVING INCREASE

1. How healthy is the congregation's giving – poor, generous, sacrificial?
2. How tax efficient is regular giving?
3. Have the envelope scheme details been cross-checked in the last 12 months
4. Would your gift aid system withstand an Inland Revenue audit?
5. Has the Diocesan Stewardship Officer visited your parish in the last 5 years?
6. When was your last Stewardship Campaign? How effective was it?
7. Is your parish paying its Parish Share?
8. If not, what prevents it? What might help?
9. Do you tithe money to charities over and above the parish share?

...THAT COMMUNITIES BE SERVED

1. What place does your church have in the local community ?
Community life is rooted in and revolves around the church ?

What are the greatest frustrations for you ?

What do you feel you are weak at and would like others to help with ?

In light of the review undertaken by the parish and then the Deanery Pastoral Committee, what has changed since the report and what effect has it had on the parish?

Can / should this church continue to exist here? Might there be other options?

Where, realistically, do you see this church being in the next 15-20 years?
