


GAL13 – Creating a QR code for your Church

A QR (Quick Response) code can be read by a camera on a smart phone, tablet computer and is used to store a website address in the form of a black and white squares. For example, the QR code shown below contains the address of the Manchester Diocese website:




To read a QR code you need to download a QR code reader app for your smart phone or tablet from an app store (e.g. Google Play, Microsoft Store or Apple App Store). For example, when searching for a QR code reader in the Google Play store the following results came up:

- Step 1




In your search engine, type in QR code maker and press enter.

We've used the QR Code Generator (www.qrstuff.com).



- Step 2



This website will open on your screen.


- Step 3



Type or copy and paste the website address you wish to use.


You can also create a QR code for your Facebook and Twitter pages, and other options, by clicking on the relevant tick box.

- Step 4




Click on the download QR code button.

- Step 5



An image file will be created and will pop up on your screen. Double click on it with your mouse to open it.


- Step 6



An image file will be created and will pop up on your screen.


Click on File and Make a Copy to save it to your records.

- Step 7




To enter it into a document (e.g. Word), click on Insert and Picture.

- Step 8



Find the location of the file you have downloaded, and click on Insert.

- Step 9



The QR will be inserted into your document.
