● INTRODUCTION

St Chad's is Rochdale's historic parish church, a Grade II* listed building situated on an eminence overlooking the busy town of Rochdale and has been a geographical and spiritual focal point for at least 800 years. This splendid building is regarded as one of the finest Parish Churches in Lancashire.

The church has important civic and community responsibilities, leading a variety of Civic Services and the Annual Mayoral Services, as well as hosting other events throughout the year including Springhill Hospice's 'Light Up A Life' Service and our annual Candlelit Service of 9 Lessons and Carols. St Chad's is also the church of choice for town funerals.

Through this document we have attempted to provide an insight into the life of the church and to express both the exciting opportunities and the tough challenges that a new incumbent will face. Worship is traditional. However, we have increasingly welcomed, catered for and involved a more ethnically diverse mix of people in our worship over the past few years. Our parishioners are committed to their church and support its day-to-day running, help with events, church flowers, church cleaning, maintaining the flower beds, and more.

We are looking for a forward-looking Priest to be the next Vicar of Rochdale.

The parish went into interregnum in July 2025 when The Revd Anne Gilbert left to be Area Dean of Rochdale. She had been with us since June 2021.

We believe there are great opportunities in our parish and are keen to find someone who will continue to develop and extend the areas of worship, ministry, mission, nurturing faith and ecumenism.

● LOCAL SETTING

Rochdale is typical of many Northern post-industrial towns and is an Urban Priority Area with an ethnically diverse mix of people. It is the Greater Manchester Town of Culture 2025-26.

The area around the church was once the commercial heart of the town and a blue plaque on the churchyard wall records that the market was held there during the Middle Ages. The church grounds and adjacent park have achieved a Green Flag Award.

There are cultural links with the twin towns of Bielefeld, Lviv, Sahiwal and Tourcoing.

The Local Authority is committed to improving and revitalizing the town centre and there has been considerable investment in a number of major projects over the past few years.

The Parish of St Chad Rochdale

Approximate key dates for the building

There is documentary evidence of a Vicar of Rochdale in 1194. There have been many reconstructions over the centuries, mainly 1470-80 when it was rebuilt in the perpendicular style. Major alterations were made in 1883-8 and a 20-year re-ordering of the interior was undertaken from 1950-70.

Approximate seating capacity

Approx 200 in the main part of the church, plus seating in the choir and Trinity and Kathryn Chapels.

When was the last Quinquennial Inspection done?

The last Quinquennial inspection was done on 2 November 2021.

What are the main things that the architect has highlighted as needing to be done?

The top 3 priorities as highlighted by the architect were:

- Replace missing slate on the chancel roof and clear leaves from blocked parapet gutter on north aisle roof.
- Inspect chancel parapet gutters for damage to linings and flashings resulting from attempted lead theft, also make good damaged roof flashings following recent attempted lead theft.
- Repair tower fall-pipe and refix loose fall-pipes to the chancel north clerestory.

How much did the Architect estimate they might cost?

No estimate as to the cost of these repairs was given by the architect at that time.

What progress has been made thus far by the parish?

- The missing slate has been replaced and the build-up of leaves from surrounding trees is monitored, with gutters being cleared at least every 12 months.
- All damage to roof flashings has been made good, with visual inspections being carried out on a regular basis.
- Tower fall-pipe has been repaired and loose fall-pipes have been made secure.

A copy of the latest Quinquennial inspection of the church will be available to visiting applicants.

How accessible are the parish buildings?

There is level entry via South Door, and an accessible toilet

There is one step up to the Nave and two steps down at the side of the High Altar; sides persons stand by to assist as required.

A hearing loop system is installed. At present there is no specific provision for those with sensory disabilities, but we always endeavour to be as helpful as possible.

St Chad's Fold is rented on a long-term lease by Skylight Circus Arts, who work closely with the community.

● LOCAL COMMUNITY

What is the social character of the area?

Our parish is economically poor. According to the Church Urban Fund 'Look up tool', the population of this parish is 8231 and ranks 90 out of 12178 where 1 is the most deprived parish.

St Chad's is situated close to the town centre and its amenities,

Is the population stationary, rising, or falling, and what is its age profile and ethnic profile?

The population is fairly static.

Age profile is from babies to the elderly.

The ethnic profile is predominantly Asian/Muslim, but Africans and East Europeans have moved in.

What would you say are the main issues facing your community?

The parish covers an area of general deprivation and housing in need of general improvement.

What kind of houses make up the bulk of the parish?

The housing stock of the parish is varied and comprises of terraced Victorian artisan housing, Victorian and Edwardian villas, semi-detached and detached houses, council properties (many now owner-occupied), housing association properties, flats and houses of multiple occupation (HMO's) and pensioners' bungalows.

What engagement with the local community does the church already have?

We engage with local schools, also with Rochdale Foodbank in the centre of town. Food is donated by the congregation and some of our parishioners have volunteered their services at the foodbank itself.

Members of the congregation are also involved as volunteers for Springhill Hospice, Restore, Cancer Research, Christian Aid, the RNLI, WRVS and service organisations such as Rotary, Inner Wheel and Probus. We also have links with Rochdale's Ukrainian church.

Services of national significance are held at St Chad's including a Commemoration Service for Queen Elizabeth II, a service to mark the Coronation of King Charles III, and the Remembrance Sunday Service each year in November.

What significant institutions such as factories, shops, offices, and hospitals are there?

Rochdale Town Hall, Riverside Council Offices and Library, Rochdale Town Centre with a mix of independent shops and well-known high-street stores, Nye Bevan House (Health Centre), Tetrosyl's main offices, Hopwood Hall College's Rochdale Campus, and Kingsway Business Park (incorporating the new Atom Valley Project).

● CHURCH-BASED ORGANISATIONS AND GROUPS

What church-based organizations and groups exist?

St Chad's Altar Guild arrange the church flowers both through the year and for special occasions and also maintain the church linens.

St Chad's has a strong musical tradition, with its Hill's pipe organ undergoing a complete restoration in 2011/12, and is blessed in having a robed choir which, although modest in number, is ably led by our Director of Music and Organist Phillip Lowe, assisted by Deputy Organist Celia Tope.

As part of our fundraising, a programme of musical events is arranged for the summer/autumn months that includes the Annual Singing Day, Saturday lunchtime concerts and also the Scott Brothers Duo for their annual celebrity concert.

Refreshments are available prior to the concerts, which are very well supported and have a healthy number of "regulars".

We have a regular, enthusiastic, group of bellringers led by tower captain Debra Holmes, with the bells being rung every Sunday morning.

The bells at St Chad's were given a major upgrade 2023-24 and there is now a ring of 10 bells. Peals have been rung to celebrate various anniversaries and centenaries, most recently to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III on 6 May 2023.

We also have visiting ringers and now have a bellringing teaching facility in place.

St Chad's operates an 'Open Church' scheme and is open to visitors on summer afternoons with volunteer guides.

There are guides, leaflets and information points in the church and a revised history of St Chad's is available for purchase.

The church also participates in the annual Heritage Open Days in September.

Where do they meet and how often?

Choir – in church, weekly rehearsal

Bellringers – in church, weekly practice, plus ringing on Sundays and special events

Altar Guild – in church, meeting weekly

Events Group – in church, quarterly meeting

Technical/Church Cleaning/Gardening team – in church, meets weekly

Worship Committee – in church, quarterly meeting

How would you describe the social life of the church?

St Chad's has a welcoming, friendly congregation.

The social life of the church is currently being reviewed to reflect the interests of the various age groups.

Events are generally well-attended and supported.

● MISSION

What is the benefice / parish's aims and objectives in mission?

A Mission Action Plan was adopted by the PCC which includes:

- Nurturing of Faith – study/prayer groups, PCC/parish quiet days
- Currently updating our mission statement
- Outreach to the community/Multi-faith Partnership
- Understanding/expansion of Lay ministry
- Encouraging vocations/ordained ministry
- Stewardship campaign
- Pastoral care
- Developing a mission for growth.

Is there a Mission Statement?

We are currently reviewing our mission statement to ensure that it fully reflects our vision and mission goals at this time, recognising the importance of developing this and the need to keep it updated.

In what ways have you seen the church growing over the last few years?

New people have joined us over the past year, including some new families, who now attend on a regular basis.

Some of the asylum seekers have remained in the area after gaining their visas and continue to attend our church.

What else should be mentioned?

We recognise that despite the positives we must not be complacent and fully recognise that we have challenges that need to be addressed.

We have an aging congregation and know that we need to find a way to attract more young families into the church to join those who have come to worship with us in recent times and so become part of St Chad's family.

● FINANCE, STEWARDSHIP AND SUSTAINABILITY

Copies of annual accounts for 2022/2023/2024/2025 are attached.

Is stewardship practised, and when was the last campaign or renewal?

We had a Stewardship Campaign in September 2024.

In what ways have you seen giving (in its broadest sense) increase in the last few years?

More parishioners have changed to giving via Standing Order, and the installation of a Digital payment machine has seen an increase in giving, especially by visitors. We are blessed that whenever we ask for volunteers to assist with specific things there are always people that volunteer their time and talents which in turn helps the task in hand to be done.

2023 - £28k 2024 – £30k 2025 - £31k

Is the benefice/parish committed to full payment of the Parish Share, and if it has failed to pay it recently what are the reasons?

St Chad's pays its revised Parish Share in full and operates a planned giving scheme suggesting levels appropriate to income. Tax payers 'Gift Aid' their contributions and we operate the 'small donations scheme' for non-taxpayers and occasional giving/donations.

Have you paid Parish Share in full in the last 5 years, if not what are the reasons?

Revised amount payable agreed after meeting with Carolyn McGloughlin, Parish Support Officer (Finance), as reported to the PCC in July 2024. Prior to 2024 the parish share not paid in full due to the lingering effects of Covid, also the old system did not take into account the Church's expenditure.

Were the parish priest's expenses of office met in full last year and what was the total sum reimbursed?

Paid in full 2024 - £1,853 and 2025 – £1,152.

To what extent does the benefice / parish offer financial support to home and overseas mission work, including projects, appeals, and charities?

Various charities are supported, including: Petrus, Rochdale Foodbank, Dementia UK, White Gift Sunday, Water Aid.

Are all parish officer posts filled? If not, what steps are you taking to address this?

All PCC officer posts are filled. Acting Safeguarding officer, work in progress to find replacement.

How is succession planning undertaken for parish officers?

Regularly reviewed, always 'work in progress' as we aim to keep all posts filled to maintain the smooth running of the PCC and the church as a whole.

We are looking for a priest...

- who is energetic and committed to our church
- whose faith is prayerful and resilient, and who values and can engage with people of all ages and diverse backgrounds
- who is keen to foster a better understanding of God's call to all people of the church community to serve His mission in the wider world, whether lay or ordained
- who would work to grow our church by ensuring that church life is welcoming, relevant and accessible
- who has an interest in music and is willing to encourage and support this important element of our worship
- who would relish the challenge of town-centre ministry whilst maintaining positive relationships with the existing congregations.

As a parish, we can offer

- a welcoming community of faith seeking leadership and guidance
- a strong desire and commitment to grow our church both spiritually and numerically
- parishioners who are dedicated and give generously of their time
- a desire to deepen our life of worship and prayer
- a church with strong choral and instrumental traditions
- a location which has good road and public transport links and easy access to the coast and countryside.

We support the Church of England Covenant for the Care and Well-Being of Clergy.

Having sought the views of the congregation, the PCC would like the new priest to be welcoming and approachable, a good listener with a sense of humour, able to care for the bereaved, sick and marginalised, and respect the traditions maintained in this church. We need a team builder with good pastoral and liturgical skills, who can communicate with all age groups, encourage growth in faith and make the congregation look forward to coming to church, build links with groups, charities, organisations, schools, the town hall, and generally promote St Chad's place at the heart of the town. The congregation appreciate a traditional style of worship and music and are keen to keep the present pattern of services, including Matins (once a month), also a concise but meaningful sermon that relates to the reading(s). In addition, there is scope to develop a children's service, with the children being involved in this.
